Websites such as PayPal, gofundme.com or fundmytravel.com offer a great way to start an online fundraising campaign.



Contact clubs, organizations and churches in your hometown. In exchange for a donation, offer to do a presentation upon your return.



Newspapers or radio stations in your hometown may be willing to contribute if you offer to write articles or do podcasts while abroad.



Pick up people's unwanted clothes, furniture and knickknacks, and organize a yard sale. One person's trash is another person's ticket abroad.



In exchange for heavy promotion and new customers, a local business may be willing to donate a percentage of a given day's sales.

more ideas...

- Sell a custom calendar with pictures from your time abroad (pre-ordered & created upon your return).
- Raffle the chance to win a date with one of your friends or a local celebrity
- Offer to take pictures abroad with a business's logo or merchandise that they could use in future advertising
- With the help of family & friends, organize a dinner or party & ask attendees for donations.
- Create a fun campaign where once you've raised X amount of money, you'll shave your head or donate your hair to Locks of Love (or, even better, get someone else to do it).

Connect your goals/activities
with your reason for doing an
education abroad program.
Describe what your program
will entail.



PARAGRAPH 4
Explain your expenses and financial situation. You may even consider breaking down costs and current funds. When it comes to money, people often appreciate transparency.



PARAGRAPH 5 Ask for help, but don't forget to say what you'll do in return!





To make giving easier for contributors (and increase your chances of receiving funds), you may want to consider including a self-addressed, stamped envelope with your letter.
